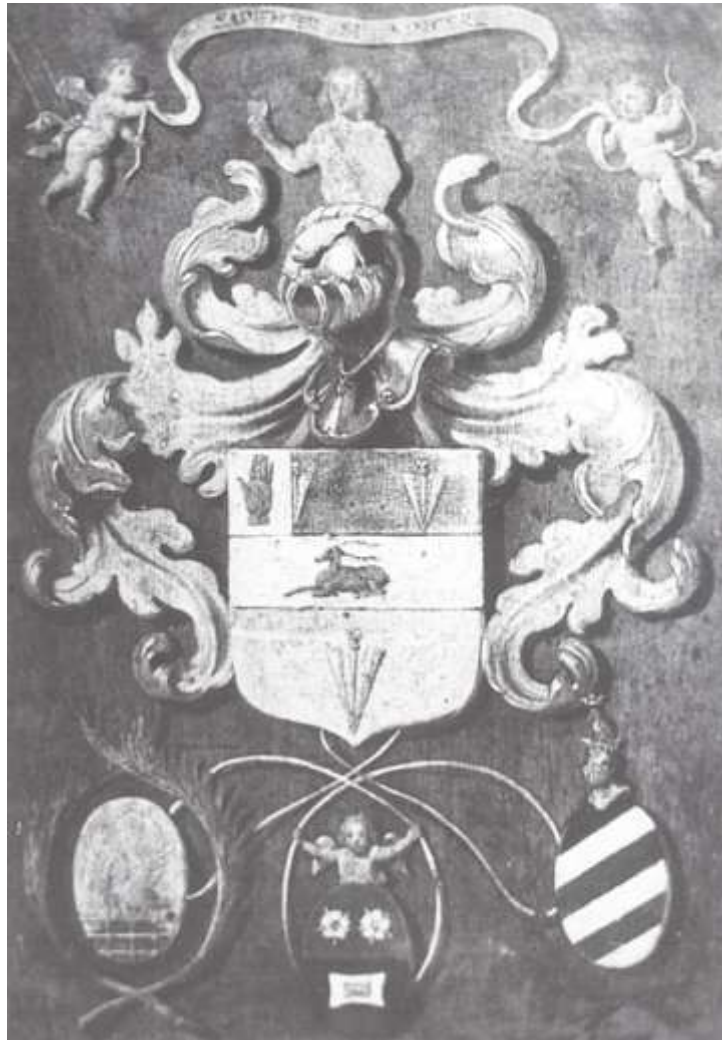


**Vol 1. 136 Sir William Davidson of Corriehill [Curriehill],

Azure on a fess Argent betwixt three pheons Or, a buck couchant Gules, attyred Sable in ye dexter centon the arms of Ulster as baronet in England being Argent a sinister hand couped Gules : on ane helmet befitting his degree with a mantle Gules doubled Argent and a wreath of his colours is set for his Crest - for his Crest a youth from the middle holding in his dexter hand a heart all Proper
